FPC Updates:

FPC Moving Forward

Presentation of FPC moving forward, membership and partnership, roles clarification

- Brief overview of the new FPC Vision & Mission
 - Vision: The FPC envisions a healthy and safe Fairfax County community free of substance misuse.
 - Mission: The FPC mission is to work side-by-side within our community to provide prevention education and resources, empowering the Fairfax County community to understand, prevent, and reduce substance misuse.
- FPC Goals: no changes, emphasis on how the FPC should link back to FPC goals and mission and vision statement.
 - o Goals:
 - Decrease the number of youth who are using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.
 - Increase youth perception of personal harms caused by alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.
 - Collaborate with community partners to address substance misuse.
 - Conduct regular assessments to examine substance misuse issues present in our Fairfax County community.
- Raymond discussed the roles of partners and members of the FPC.
 - FPC Partners: A partner of the FPC is a person acting as a representative of an agency within the Fairfax County government. Partners' role is to support the FPC by connecting the coalition to resources and programs that further the mission of the

FPC to understand, prevent, and reduce substance misuse within the Fairfax County community.

- FPC Members: An FPC member is someone representing themselves as a resident of Fairfax County. An FPC Member will attend monthly FPC meetings and lead the planning, development, and implementation of FPC activities (supported by the FPC Coordinator).
- Examples of FPC Members

 - Nonprofit
 - Parent
 - Young person
- Future restructuring for the FPC will include an emphasis on youth involvement in the general body. The goal is to eventually create a secondary coalition that is youth-led.
- Through the FPC, there will be a focus on working on what is happening in the community, as reported by members, and then how partners can amplify what is being reported on.
- Expressed goal to obtain drug free community grant funding and will utilize the 12 sectors framework to do so.
- There was group discussion about who in the community is consistently "coming to the table," who is missing, and what ideas are there for recruitment.

Next steps for the FPC

- FPC Members meeting moving forward will be held monthly at 6:30pm and the next meeting will be in September. These meetings will continue virtually but will transition to in-person meetings in upcoming months.
- FPC Partner meetings will be held quarterly, and the next meeting is scheduled for October. The day and time are TBD and Caitlin will send out a poll via email to obtain partner input about preferred dates and times.
- FPC Partners will be updated by FPC members about current coalition activities, partners will update FPC members on activities happening and how we can work together side-by-side within the community.
